We have been blessed this year with ten ordinations, one (Filipino) to the diaconate and nine to the priesthood. Six Vietnamese will become priests, along with one Filipino, one Ghanaian and one Nigerian. We have a new community in Ghana still searching for a permanent home. Our novice master is 87 years young and still works hard each day in his service of the Lord! Imagine being 87 and moving from America, to the Philippines and then to Ghana! Our oldest Paraclete priest celebrates his 94th birthday on Christmas Eve. Every Saturday he goes to visit people in a local nursing home, accompanying a priest who celebrates liturgy for the residents.

We have ten men in the early stages of religious formation and another ten in temporary vows. All of them need computers, books, money for traveling to and from school, clothing, medical care, etc. Most of our members come from very poor countries and their families are not able to provide support for them during their seminary training. We need your generosity to assist us in getting them to ordination.

The growth of the Servants of the Paraclete and their mission is needed more and more each day as priests around the globe struggle with many of the same issues that all priests face in their daily lives.

We are set to serve wherever we are called!

We thank you for your fidelity and generosity over the years and promise to remember you and your loved one's faithfully in our daily prayers and Masses.

May God bless you all and grant you a joy filled Christmas and a healthy and Happy New Year.
